Students at four schools in Vancouver, Deep Cove, and Kelowna will be involved in this dynamic initiative; **Lord Byng Senior Secondary**, **Queen Elizabeth Elementary**, **Seycove Secondary**, and **Mount Boucherie Secondary** schools.

Students have the exciting experience of working directly with a CMC Associate Composer and producing interdisciplinary collaborations with fellow students in other areas of the school, including creative writing, film, visual arts, and drama. Through the mentorships and collaborations, the students are given compositional tools and the unique knowledge, experiences and insights from the Associate Composers that are needed for them to discover their own compositional "voices".
